Stilt Fishermen In Koggala (An Organized)

Stilt fishing is a method unique to Sri Lanka. The fishermen usually sit on a crossbar that is tied to a vertical pole driven into the sand several meters deep offshore. This is an organized photo session hiring a few stilt fishermen both at sunrise and sunset, with the possibility of requesting them to pose for photos. The intention of photography in this session is to showcase the traditional stilt fishing method in a silhouette photography style. Moreover, ND filters and a tripod can be used to take long exposure shots of the moving water with the stilt fishermen. It is also possible to take close-up portraits to highlight their facial features after sunrise. Fundamental photography techniques to consider in this session include natural framing, backlighting, silhouettes, and long exposure etc.



#### Ancient Ruins And Monks In Polonnaruwa (An Organized)

Polonnaruwa ruins vividly reflect the golden age and show some of the most well-preserved architectural treasures of Sri Lanka. This is an organized photo session with a request for special permission to enter the ruins area from the Department of Archaeology for sunrise and arranging some young Buddhist monks for the photo session. The intention of photography in this session is to show the ancient architecture of Sri Lanka and add liveliness to the ruins by capturing young monks in front of the ruins. Fundamental photography techniques to consider in this session include natural framing and backlighting, etc.



An Elephant & A Mahout In Sigiriya (An Organized)

Mahouts, often known as elephant handlers, work closely with captive Asian elephants. The daily tasks of mahouts can include feeding, cleaning, or bathing elephants. This is an organized photo session hiring an elephant and a mahout and bringing them near the lake in front of Sigiriya Rock. The intention of photography in this session is to show the bond between an elephant and a mahout and how the elephant can pose and react according to the orders of the mahout for the photos. Fundamental photography techniques to consider in this session include natural framing and backlighting etc.



Sri Lanka's Indigenous Veddas' In Dambana (An Organized)

The Veddas are Sri Lanka's aboriginal inhabitants, dating back to prior to the 6th century BCE. Today, they live in regular in houses and huts, with only a few still maintaining the traditional long hair and beards. This is an organized photo session hiring a few Veddas to shoot in their small hut and the surrounding area, which is away from the regular touristic Vedda village nearby. The intention of photography in this session is to showcase the aboriginal appearance of the Veddas, their culture. Fundamental photography techniques to consider in this session include natural framing, backlighting, bokeh etc. A black cloth background can also be used in this session to isolate the faces of the Veddas and capture their facial features.



Tea Pluckers On Tea Field In Dambethenna (An Organized)

The majority of Sri Lankan tea pluckers and tea workers are ethnically Indian Tamils, a people who were transported by the British to work on the plantations in 1860s. This is an organized photo session hiring a few tea pluckers in a tea field in a rural high mountain area, with the possibility of requesting them to pose for photos that showcase the traditional tea plucking hand movements. The intention of photography in this session is to highlight the traditional tea plucking methods used to process Ceylon tea, their colorful traditional cloths and their beautiful facial expressions. Fundamental photography techniques to consider in this session include natural framing, backlighting, motion and movement, and bokeh etc.



Rural Tamil Village In Dambethenna (A Candid)

There is a stark contrast in living conditions in these Tamil rural villages compared to the rest of the country, where many of the basic facilities that are granted are either of poor quality or missing altogether. This is a candid photo session walking around the village and capturing the environment and the people who live there. The intention of photography in this session is to showcase the Tamil tea workers' underprivileged lifestyle, the threadbare clothes they wear, and the colorful slums they inhabit. Fundamental photography techniques to consider in this session include natural framing, backlighting and bokeh, etc. A black cloth background can also be used in this session to isolate the faces of the villagers and capture their facial features.




#### **Pettah Market In Colombo (A Candid)**

Pettah is one of the biggest and most functional market spaces in Sri Lanka. It's filled with huge trucks and porters carrying loads on their shoulders, with onions, potatoes, and spices everywhere. This is a candid photo session capturing the market's vibrant atmosphere, focusing on the actions of hard workers and the emotions reflected in their close-up faces. The intention of photography in this session is to tell a story through a series of images that reveal the harsh reality of their labor. Fundamental photography techniques to consider in this session include natural framing, motion and movement, backlighting, bokeh, panning, long exposure, etc.



Seema Malakaya Temple In Colombo (A Sightseeing)

One of Colombo's most photographed sights is on an island on the east side of the South Beira Lake. Standing tall along the banks of Beira Lake, Seema Malaka forms a part of the southern region of the Colombo City of Sri Lanka. The temple is constructed on three platforms over water, which are connected to the mainland and with each other by pontoon bridges. All three platforms have numerous seated Buddha statues displaying different mudras. Moreover, you can also see the impressive skyscrapers surrounding the area, making it a perfect place to click some memorable photos.



Sigiriya Rock Fortress In Sigiriya (Sightseeing)

Sigiriya is an ancient rock fortress and it is a site of historical and archaeological significance that is dominated by a massive column of granite rock approximately 180m high. The fortress complex includes remnants of a ruined palace, surrounded by an extensive network of fortifications, vast gardens, ponds, canals, alleys, and fountains. Halfway up the Sigiriya rock an open-air spiral stairway leads to a long, sheltered gallery in the sheer rock face. The paintings of the buxom, wasp-waisted women are popularly believed to represent King Kasyapa's concubines.



Dambulla Cave Temple In Dambulla (Sightseeing)

Dambulla is a world heritage site in Sri Lanka, situated in the central part of the country. This temple complex dates back to the first century BCE. Dambulla is the largest and best preserved cave temple complex in Sri Lanka. The temple is composed of five caves of varying sizes and magnificence. Five separate caves contain about 150 absolutely stunning Buddha statues and paintings, some of Sri Lanka's most important and evocative religious art. Buddha images were first created here over 2000 years ago, and over the centuries subsequent kings added to and embellished the cave art.



Scenic Train Journey From Haputale To Nanu Oya (Sightseeing)

This is a scenic train ride through the beautiful mountains of tropical Sri Lanka. The views on both sides of the rail are breathtaking. The train winds through the mountains overlooking farms and villages and of course vast tea plantations while scenery changes throughout the trip. Being in 3rd class you will meet a lot of locals and most will enjoy having a chat with you. Hanging out of the train gives you the best views and is an awesome feeling but be careful not to leave your limbs out of the train at the wrong time as there are trees and tunnels that come close to the train.



Damro Tea Factory In Labookellie (A Sightseeing)

At the factory visitors can learn everything about Ceylon tea, while witnessing the step-by-step process of the manufacturing process. The visitors are taken on a guided tour of the factory and the process of how tea is manufactured, graded and packed for export is explained and get an understanding of why certain teas taste as they do. The tea shop within the factory premises makes for a great buy of factory fresh and various grades to choose from.
